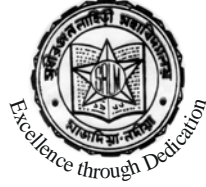

Part-A

Plan and Programme

We have undertaken following measures to streamline the teaching-learning-evaluation process:

Section I

- 1) Provided facilities for academic counseling to the Part-I, Part-II and Part-III examinees.
- 2) Imposed strict restrictions on class bunking which yielded positive result.
- 3) Made provision for financial assistance to the students on the basis of merit, class attendance and economic status.
- 4) Provided tutorial classes and subject counseling in the class routine.
- 5) Students are given the opportunity to see their answer scripts after the evaluation is over.
- 6) We have increased the seats in different Honours and General subjects.
- 7) We have encouraged organization of Departmental seminars by faculty members, Guest Scholars and also by our students.

Section II

As our College is a NAAC accredited College, so we are to design our annual plan of action so as to follow up the suggestions conveyed by the NAAC Peer Team in their Peer Team Report.

Section III

We have decided to implement following merged schemes of development projects under the guidelines of the University Grants Commission under XIth plan:

- Improvement of infrastructural facilities in the existing premises;
- Coaching classes for entry in service for SC,ST,OBC candidates;
- Remedial Coaching for SC,ST,OBC students;
- Introduction of Career Counselling cell;
- Providing monetary benefits to socially and economically backward students.

Section IV

We have laid stress on college beautification and gardening. Sri Apurba Kr. Sar, H.O.D., Bengali is in charge for this purpose.

Section V

Perhaps ours is the only college, which has paid so much of importance towards the development of sports and games. The success rate of our students in sports and games is praiseworthy. The College also provides gymnasium facilities.

Section VI

Magazines are regularly published with the active involvement of teachers and students. A large number of students contribute to the magazines. College Magazine doesn't mean just the annual magazine 'Pratyasha' for this college. Most of the departments regularly publish Wall Magazines with contributions by students. 'Sampratik', 'Spandan', 'Krirabarta', 'Polis', 'History Untold', 'Spark', 'Sahitya Bitan', 'Society Today' and 'Jiban Darshan' are familiar wall magazines which adorn corridor walls of our college.

Section VII

The college consists of three National Service Scheme (NSS) units. These units regularly undertake several community programmes for the students so as to get them familiar with the community needs and social linkages of education. NSS seeks to awaken and promote social commitment of the students. Considering increasing demand of the to have enrolment in the NSS , we have already applied for opening two more NSS units(one for boys and one for girls) in this College. We hope that this will be materialized very shortly.

The unit of NCC of this college is traditionally a matter of pride. The NCC cadets participate in several state and national camps like, National Integration Camp, RD Parade, Rock climbing and Attachment with regular army and a good number of our former cadets have got absorbed into police and defence services.

Section IX

The college now boasts of a Book Bank. It is a student’s controlled library that serves themselves throughout the year. The College has also departmental Library in each of its departments, which are run by the faculty members of the respective department. The students may have their reference books from there. The college also runs a **Health Club** for students with the assistance of medical personnel of the adjoining block.

The S R L Mahavidyalaya **Cine Club** has also been an area of attraction to the students. Equipments necessary for exhibition are kept there under the supervision of the club.

Section X:

Our institution feels that a vocational orientation is a must in today’s world. We therefore run a computer centre in partnership with BRAINWARE, a reputed concern in the field of imparting Computer Training in West Bengal.

Other facilities and Extension wing of the college include Career Counseling and Employment Cell.

Section XI:

In order to ensure more accurate and scientific student data keeping we have installed a students' software package.

Section XII:

The college has attempted to reach beyond the privileged few who get a chance to be a student of this institution. In this pursuit, we have opened up a Study Centre of Netaji Subhas Open University where many a drop out as well as the employed gets a scope to enhance their knowledge and acquire institutional degree.

Evaluation:

The plans and programmes that have been mentioned above are evaluated through various ways:

- 1) Academic performance of the students is reflected in the final result of the students, the details of which are given in the Annexure-1A & 1B.
- 2) Other yardstick to measure the academic excellence of the students is to look at the number of students progressed towards postgraduate studies and thereafter engaged in services. However, we do not have adequate infrastructure for keeping these data methodically.
- 3) Overall activities of the college are evaluated on the basis of feedback; we have been taking from the outgoing 3rd year students since 2005, which reflects the opinion of the students after three years of their study in this College about the teaching learning process, teacher student relationship and after all overall impression of the College.(details of which are available in the College Office)
- 4) We have introduced teacher- guardian meeting of the first year students to get our academic and other activities assessed by guardians. The comments, suggestions made in these meetings are considered in responsive manner. If complaints are raised pertaining to a particular department, the relevant departmental committee addresses them with the help the Teachers' Council Secretary and the Principal. But in case of a suggestion/ complaint, which is general in nature, the Teachers' council would deliberate on it to find ways to execute it or take corrective measures. The Joint Staff Council also meets occasionally to decide on major issues pertaining to policy changes where the members of the Teachers' Council as well as Staff Council interact democratically.
- 5) During last year we have started most of the schemes under UGC XIth plan(details of which are given in the next section of this report. Necessary formalities are being going on to start remaining schemes within the ongoing academic session.

Part-B**Academic activities:**

Our College is situated in a rural backward area. As a result of which most of the students come from socially and economically backward sections and most of them are first generation learners. In spite of that fact , it occupies an academically healthy position among the Colleges of the affiliating University i.e. University of Kalyani. The academic excellence of our College is reflected by the percentage of success of our students in the final University level Examination and number of students obtaining first classes in that Examination. Seminar and Research activities:

The Seminar and Research activities of this Institution are run under the complete supervision of a Subcommittee, which is popularly known as **Seminar and Research Forum**. Sri Amal Kanta Das of Dept of Economics is its Convener. It is one of the most important organs of the college. This Forum, though works within the administrative periphery of the college, is a well-known department in the entire district. It has been the centre for the development of inter-departmental exchanges and academic exercises for the teachers, students, research scholars of all categories, be they within the college or outside college including the research institutions. The Seminar and Research Forum regularly conducts internal seminars as well as UGC sponsored State-level and National level seminars/conferences and workshops. It plays the role of coordinator for different subject and departments in the college and also acts as facilitator in their endeavour to organise any research related work or seminars, etc.

Last year the forum organized an internal Seminar on 'Water, the Looming Crisis in India'. Prof. Binayak Roy, Fellow, Australian National University, Sydney, Australia, Dr. Uttam Kumar Bhattacharjee, IDSK and Sri Amal Kanta Das, Convener of the forum delivered their valuable lecture in that seminar.

Further under the direct supervision of the forum Department of Commerce & Economics of this College jointly organized in collaboration with KARMA, an NGO, an UGC sponsored National Level Seminar on '**Right to Employment in Rural Perspective**'. 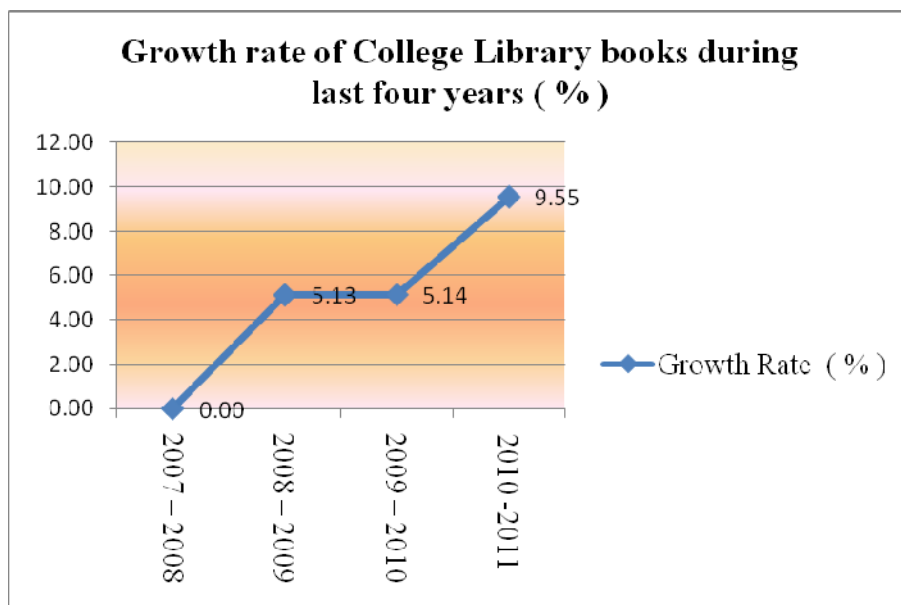

Library:

Presently in our College Library we have good number of reference books covering subjects of literature, Social Science, Geography including emerging subjects like Defence Studies. Besides, there is adequate number of textbooks. The purchase of new books in the library is a continuous process. Every department purchases books throughout the year depending on their requirements. During financial year 2010-11 we have purchased 1481 new books(value Rs.2,82,790) in our College Library, some of which are text books and rests are reference books. Now in our library total number of copies stands at 15,500. We have also computerized the accession system of our library and have planned to provide Internet facilities to our students during college hours. 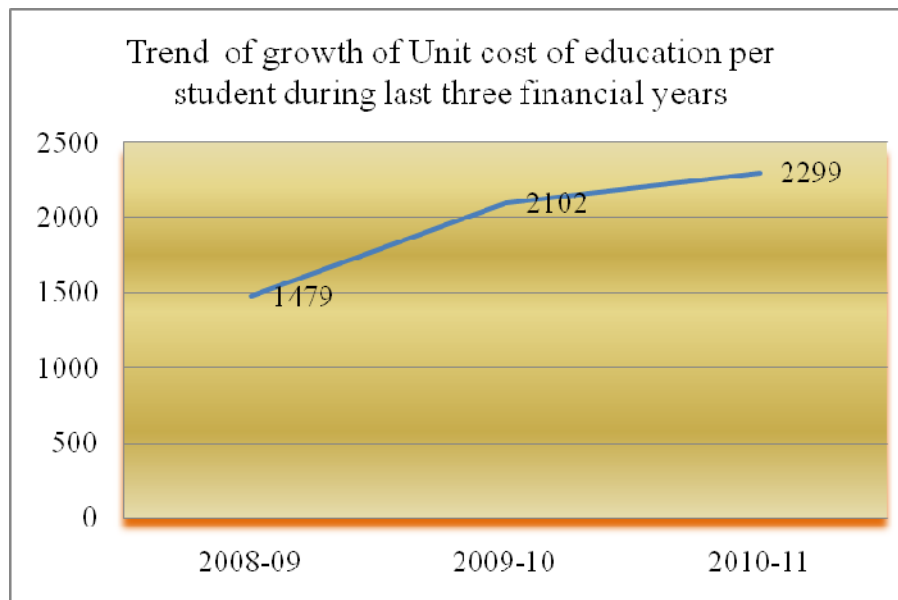

Audit:

The auditing of our institution is up-to-date. We have already completed Statutory Audit for the year 2010-11. The Internal Audit Mechanism is up to date.

Unit Cost of Education:

During the financial year 2010-11 we spent Rs.2299 per student without the Salary component of permanent teachers and staff members, which are paid totally out of Grant-in-aid received from the Government. The trend of growth of unit cost of education per student during last three financial years may be highlighted from the following :

**Student Aid fund:**

During the financial year 2010-11 we have incurred Rs.63,740.00(which was Rs. 93,795.00 in previous year) from the Student Aid Fund in the interest of talented students come from economically weaker section of the society.

Alumni Association:

The Alumni Association of the College is popularly known as Sudhiranjan Lahiri Mahavidyalaya Alumni and Welfare Association . It is one of the most important organ of the College, which is used as the platform for keeping relationship with ex-students . Every year it organizes its Annual Conference and Cultural function. Dr. Md. A.Ali (Dept. of Bengali) is the convener of this Association.

Use of Computer:

Our College has been using computers in various academic and administrative departments for improvement in administrative efficiency. Computers have been installed in college library, Accounts Office and also in general administrative department. The admission, accounts system as well as library accessioning, cataloguing and clarifying have been fully computerized. Very recently students software has been installed in this College in order to storing data relating to the students of the College. Most of the computers have been connected to the Campus LAN. The college has hosted one Website. The URL of our Website is <http://www.srlm.org> .We have already started to distribute 1st year admission form and displaying different important College notices through our College website.

Increase in Infrastructural facilities:

- Last year we have submitted to the University Grants Commission an integrated building plan under XIth Plan to ensure early solution the problem arising out of adequate number of Class rooms.
- We have purchased new furniture and equipment valued Rs.1,91,487.50.
- We have purchased new computer and accessories valued Rs.8,02,320.

Retirement of Faculty member:

Last year one of our senior Faculty members Sri Saradindu De Sikder , Associate Professor in Mathematics in the Department of Commerce has retired from his service. We, on behalf of this College family hope his peaceful retired life.

Further designation of two Staff members namely Sri Anjan Mitra and Kartick Chandra Dutta have also been upgraded from Typist to Cashier and Bearer to Clerk respectively. We, also on behalf of this College family heartily congratulate them.

Innovative Practices:

- We have a committee under the G.B. to look into the entire affairs relating to the recruitment, service condition and pay structure of the Part-time / Contractual teachers/guest teachers and to suggest appropriate measures. The committee consists of Dr. S.N. Kar, Principal & Secretary of G.B. as Chairman, Dr. Md. A. Ali, Sri K.R.Saha and Sri B.Majumder as other members. On the basis of suggestion of the said committee we have already started necessary formalities for fixation of pay of our Part-time Faculty members as per new regulation framed by the Government of West Bengal.
- We have laid considerable emphasis on promoting research activities by the teachers which have reported extensively under the column 'Seminar and Research Forum'.
- We have started an award for best library user.
- We have adopted a 'Student Charter' – a written statement of the learning rights and obligations of students as suggested by NAAC. For the promotion of student participation in quality assurance we print the 'Student Charter' in the college prospectus every year and also display it in the Library Reading Room.
- We have also a Grievance Cell as follow up measure consisting of the following members:

 - Prof.Manasi Maiti, HOD, Deptt. of Philosophy (Convener)
 - Smt.Mahua Maulik(Secretary, Teachers' Council)
 - Sri Kartick Ch. Dutta (Secretary, Non-teaching Staff Council)
 - Sri Tapas Ghosh (General Secretary, Students' Union)
 - Ms. Soma Biswas (Girls' Student representative)
 - Sri S. Bandyopadhyay (Coordinator,IQAC)

The meeting of the Cell is generally held fortnightly on Tuesday at the Principal's Chamber. The presence of either Chairperson or Convener and Lady Teacher representative, Girl Students' representative and Students' Union Secretary are compulsory for a meeting of the Grievance Cell.

➤ **Felicitation:** The College regularly felicitates her students who have excelled in the University level Examinations, in Sports and Games as well as in extracurricular activities. It provides impetus for them and current students as well for making good prospect.

➤ The college finds pleasure to announce that the Parents-Teacher committee has taken genuine interest to suggest opinions regarding the betterment of the college. It has been a healthy sign so far as the college is

concerned. Similarly, the Student-Teacher committees of different departments have also undertaken steps to prepare and execute different programmes on behalf of their departments. A number of Wall Magazines have already been published by different departments which manifest the integrity of the students and teachers as a whole.

Follow up of NAAC report:

We have stated in the earlier section of this report that we are to design our plan of actions so as to ensure follow up of NAAC report. Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has been monitoring this and uses to make necessary suggestions and recommendations for this purpose to the Authority. May we request all the Faculty Members, Staff members, students and other stakeholders to co-operate the College Authority to implement those plans of actions effectively.

Status of implementation of schemes under UGC XIth plan:

Under XIth plan (2007 – 2012) our college has got assistance from UGC under (i) General Development Grant (ii) Merged Scheme (iii) Additional Assistance Scheme. Those schemes consist of several development plans and programmes which we have taken for successful implementation. Some of them are;

A. Grants for Books and Journals :

Books for all departments purchased.

B. Grants for Teaching equipments:

Computer for students, Xerox, Public Address System, LCD Projector, LED TV, Digital Camera etc.

C. Grants for Infrastructure Development :

Silent Generator Set, Inverter.

D. Field work / Study Tour:

Departments of Bengali and History have conducted study tours.

E. Conveyance allowance provided to students, who come from long distance.

F. Scholarship stipend provided to students for economically deprived, BPL card holders etc.

G. Remedial coaching class is arranged for students belonging to Minority and economically deprived communities and also for general students in some special circumstances in various subjects.

H. Coaching class for School Service Commission Examination in Bengali and History were arranged under the scheme of Entry in services.

I. Career Counseling Cell has been opened and a separate room has been assigned for that purpose. Few workshops have already been conducted. Ten Broad Band connections have been installed from BSNL in various places and departments for smooth and quick access to internet facility for students and staffs of this institution.

J. Laptop and other accessories with Wireless net connection have given to teaching faculty members for the improvement of academic and research facility as a whole.

H. We have subscribed software and installed LAN facility for better Co – ordination of office work as well as for the betterment of the students.

We do have plan to equip class rooms with all types of digital amenities (P/A system, LCD Projector, LED TV etc). Library Facility has been improved with internet facility and open access system. We are going to subscribe for “SOUL” software and INFLIBNET Facility. UGC has approved Building Grants for construction of student’s office, Common room and canteen, toilet for girl students. UGC committee members are trying their best to implement these schemes for promoting all kinds of infrastructural facilities for all round development of the college.

Activities of the Faculty Members:

a) Performance of the faculty members in discharging their academic responsibilities:

Teachers’ performances in taking their allotted classes as well as performing their allotted examination duties are fairly good. In this context it deserves special mention that apart from taking their allotted classes they have also participated in official work as and when required in order to avoid disruption of normal official works for want of adequate non-teaching staff.

b) Participation of the Faculty members in different Faculty Development Programmes:

During the session 2010-11 Smt. Mahua Maulik (Dept. of History) participated in UGC sponsored Refresher course held at UGC Academic Staff College , University of Calcutta. Apart from that Sri K.Pal,

, Sri K.R.Saha ,Smt.M.Maulik, Sri A.K.Das ,Sri B.Majumder ,Sri S.Bandyopadhyay,Sri A Chakraborty , Dr.S.Sarkar , Sri S Biswas participated in different International/National/ State level Seminars/Conferences held at different Institutions .Details of which are available in the Performance Appraisals of the concerned Teacher.

c) Publication by the Faculty members:

During the academic session 2010-11 Sri A. K. Das, H.O.D, Economics and Dr. S.Sarkar, H.O.D,Sociology have got their papers published in different journals/ edited volumes. Sri B. Majumder, Department of Bengali published one Poem Criticism titled '**Mangal Kabyo-Kabikankan Chandi**'. We congratulate them all. We are also delighted to announce that some of our faculty members have presented their researched articles in different National/State level seminars/conferences(details of which are available in the Performance Appraisals of the concerned teacher). We also congratulate them all.

d) Achievement of good number of Teaching days:

We are happy to announce that last year we have achieved 192 days teaching days, which is much above the UGC stipulation. We convey lot of thanks to all the Faculty members for co-operating the College Authority for ensuring such achievement.

e) Engagement of the Faculty Member in another Institution:

We are also delighted to announce that Prof. S. De Sikdar, Guest Lecturer in Mathematics in the Department of Commerce (Ex-Associate Professor and Head of the department of Commerce), is attached with the Rabindra Bharati University as Guest Lecturer in PG department. Further we are also delighted to announce that Sri Kabiranjan Saha , Associate Professor and Head of the Department of History , Smt. Mahua Maulik , Assistant Professor(Sr.sc.) , Department of History and Sri Bhabesh Majumder , Assistant Professor , Department of Bengali are attached with the DODL , University of Kalyani , Srikrishna College Study Centre , Bagula , Nadia, West Bengal for taking classes in the Post Graduation Departments in their respective subjects.

Part-C

Our Weaknesses and Tasks Ahead:

- a) The success rate of the English(Hons) students is not satisfactory. May we request all of the Faculty members to think positively to overcome the situation in the ongoing academic session.
- b) Number of students, whose result in the Final University Level Examination has remained withheld due to their inability to be qualified in Part-II Examination , has reached to alarming situation. May we request the Convener and the members of the Academic Council to design appropriate course of action to avoid the recurrence of the same from ongoing session.
- c) Inadequacy of number of students in the Commerce Department is still in existence. May we again request all the Faculty members to think positively to overcome the situation in near future.
- d) We have also failed to ensure at least one journal for each department in our College Library. May we request all the Faculty members to come forward and co-operate the Library sub-committee so as to materialize our target at our earliest convenience.
- e) Scarcity of adequate Whole-time Teachers is still in existence. In this context we are sorry to announce that the Department of English is being running without any Whole-time Teacher. Again three Departments , namely Department of Political Science, Sociology and Philosophy are being running with only one Whole-time Teacher.Thus we have to take appropriate plan of action so as to ensure immediate filling up of all the vacant Whole-time Teaching posts as well as creation of new Whole-time Teaching posts.
- f) In the last session we have failed to organize Teacher-Guardian meeting of all the Departments. We have to think positively in this regard in the ongoing session.
- g) In the last session Grievance redressal cell has been failed conduct their meeting as per stated schedule. We have to look into the matter from the current session.
- h) We have to think positively to form Anti-ragging Cell following UGC guideline from the ongoing academic session.
- i) Demands for new class room is still in existence .We have to take appropriate plan of action to that effect.

- j) We will develop mechanism so that every student is involved in the community service programme and finally,
- k) We will attempt to involve every teacher, staff member and students in the activities for quality enhancement of higher education.
